Implementation, Content and Sequencing <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Weekly sessions are timetabled to ensure coverage however, links with other subjects are made where possible.• Due to the mixed age classes, we have a two -year rolling programme.• Teaching builds according to the age and needs of the pupils with developmentally appropriate learning objectives.• During RSE, particularly in Key Stage 2 the content is taught to individual year groups.	
 Links with other subjects <p>Where possible PSHE is linked within other subjects and through enrichment days. Each year we always participate in Anti-Bullying Week, Children's Mental Health Week, and Internet Safety Day.</p> <p>The school also holds a Health and Well-Being Week during the summer term which has an emphasis on PSHE and sport.</p>	 Impact <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All children will have a good understanding of the complexities of life and the skills base to navigate their way through relationships and have the tolerance and understanding of others.• The children will become confident individuals who have knowledge of how to keep themselves safe and healthy	 Progress <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The learning is planned so that the units are built upon across the classes.• Learners are given verbal feedback in the lessons.• Much of the learning is through discussions and practical tasks. Therefore some learning is captured through class mind maps and photographs.	 Support <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Parents are updated half termly on the curriculum overviews so they are aware of what is being covered. Teachers send out additional information on RSE lessons.• Teachers ensure the majority of pupils meet age related expectations but may adapt learning through pre teaching and 1:1 support.
